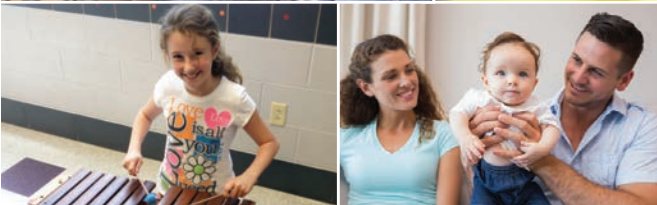

You don't have to look far these days to find someone who could use a helping hand. Right here in Kettering, needs are all around us. Every day brings new opportunities to improve someone's life and become a positive force in our own community.

Since 2001, the Community Foundation for Kettering has been helping area organizations that help our city's residents. Inspired by the vision of its founder, long-time Kettering supporter Lucille Seitz, the Foundation makes grant awards to programs and organizations that...

- Enhance the education, health, and well-being of our children
- Enrich the lives of our senior adults
- Protect our most vulnerable citizens
- Promote the arts in our community

The Foundation was established in partnership with The Dayton Foundation, which provides oversight and pooling of resources to maximize return on investments.

Thanks to charitable giving of many donors, the Community Foundation for Kettering has been able to distribute more than \$1,600,000 since its inception to support programs that improve the lives of Kettering residents.



Doing the Right Things

Big Brothers Big Sisters – Helps young people shape a path to successful adulthood by improving social behavior, emotional wellbeing, and academic skills through mentorship with an adult volunteer.

Brigid's Path – Cares for infants born to addicted mothers by tracking their heart rates and oxygen saturation during sleep, using special baby monitors funded by a Foundation grant.

Clothes That Work – Prepares Kettering teens for the workplace, offering free workshops that teach soft skills and workplace etiquette, in addition to providing clients with work attire for employment success.

Crayons to Classrooms – Invites volunteers to work for shopping credits that allow teachers from Kettering schools to shop at a "free" store for supplies to assist their students in need.

Hannah's Treasure Chest – Provides Kettering families in need with new and gently used items such as diapers, clothing, shoes, and cribs through its large network of school districts and nonprofits.

Kettering Backpack – Feeds at-risk Kettering students, providing a bag of food every Friday during the school year to meet nutritional needs when school breakfasts and lunches are not available.

Ohio's Hospice of Dayton – Helps children find a way forward after loss through the Healing Pathways program, which guides them in experiencing grief in a safe, stable environment.

YWCA Dayton – Supports individuals fleeing domestic violence, encouraging them to use the Crisis and Domestic Violence Hotline's text and chat features when verbal communication is not safe.
